Funds Management


In 2022-2023, WHFP successfully managed a budget of over \$3,3 mln from various international donors such as IPPF, UNFPA, CARE, OSF, FCDO, BMZ, and the Japanese, Canadian, and German Governments. As a fully accredited member of IPPF, WHFP has established robust accountability mechanisms to ensure the effective implementation of programs and proper management of funds.

Background

- Since February 24, 2022, Ukraine has been under a full-scale Russian military invasion. Millions of people across Ukraine continue to be affected by ongoing warfare. Over 6.3 million people have fled Ukraine, with 3.5 million people officially registered as IDPs within Ukraine.
- In many regions, quality and timely medical, psychological, legal and social services are not easily accessible or are limited.
- The war has exacerbated gender-based violence (GBV) and increased risks of conflict-related sexual violence (CRSV). According to UNFPA, 3.6 million people require GBV prevention and response services assistance.
- At all levels of healthcare, the availability of emergency contraception, post-rape kits, and safe abortion pills remains a challenge.



"The Ukrainian healthcare system has managed to survive and continue functioning, thanks to our people's heroic and dedicated efforts. However, it has also become more stable and resistant to challenges, largely due to the support of international donors and partners. Our Foundation has gained valuable experience working with various donors, which is especially important given the difficult circumstances in Ukraine, where many people, including women and adolescents, are in dire need. The support we receive enables us to provide high-quality SRH, GBV and CSE services to our fellow citizens, improving their health and safety."



WHFP Activities and Achievements in 2022-2023

Advocacy Wins

WHFP is the only NGO that works on safe abortions in Ukraine.

Thus, our experts as part of the working group improved the Clinical Protocol for safe abortion in the I and II trimesters per WHO standards. The following MOH Orders were approved in August 2023 and in February WHFP together with UNFPA, government representatives, civil society leaders, experts, and healthcare workers launched a public discussion through a set of regional and national roundtables on the improvement of access to SRH services for women with disabilities in **Ukraine.** In the outcome, the Resolution to ensure the elimination of discrimination was agreed upon and handed over to the principal state institutions for legislation improvement. As a result, the MOH updated a list of equipment and commodities for OBGYN care with transformable gynaecological chairs.

Capacity Building of Healthcare Professionals

WHFP has trained a total of 5,850 healthcare providers including OBGYNs, GPs, nurses and midwives from all Ukrainian government-controlled regions. Topics included:
